

Introduction

Race to Resilience (R2R) (https://racetozero.unfccc.int/join-the-race-to-resilience/) is a global campaign - the sibling to Race to Zero (RtZ) - catalysing a step-change in global ambition for climate resilience, putting people and nature first in pursuit of a resilient world where we do not just survive climate shocks and stresses but thrive in spite of them.

R2R is led by the High-Level Climate Champions for Climate Action and was launched at the Climate Adaptation Summit on 25 January 2021 by Alok Sharma, COP26 President-designate, after an opening statement from Ban Ki-moon, 8th Secretary-General of the United Nations.

Goals:

- By 2030, to catalyse action by non-state actors that builds the resilience of 4 billion people from groups and communities who are vulnerable to climate risks.
- By 2050, to live in a world where all communities thrive in the face of the multiple risks and uncertainty posed by climate change.

Non-state actor-led regional, national or global initiatives (alliances, networks, partnerships, associations, consortia, platforms etc.) are invited to register their interest in joining the Race to Resilience by completing the form below.

Every Expression of Interest (EoI) will be reviewed by three members of the R2R Expert Review Group (ERG) (https://racetozero.unfccc.int/governance/). The ERG provides technical advice on the campaign. This includes advising the High-Level Climate Champions about which partner initiatives should be included, or not, in the R2R Campaign for the Champions' final decision. On the next page, you will find the eligibility criteria.

Eligibility criteria

There are two types of eligibility criteria: inclusion/exclusion criteria and decision criteria.

INCLUSION/EXCLUSION CRITERIA are criteria that an initiative must meet or agree to if it wants to be part of the campaign. These criteria usually lead to closed questions, which means that the answers are "yes" or "no". These types of questions are the first filter that determines which initiatives will be evaluated by the ERG.

The initiatives wishing to join the campaign must:

- Share the goals of the R2R: to deliver a step-change in global ambition for climate resilience, putting people and nature first towards a 4bn people goal, by taking transformative actions at scale that are measurable and/or by promoting enabling conditions and systemic transformations driving resilience.
- · Be led by non-state actors.
- Be open to new members.
- Not be a project or programme led by an organisation.
- Agree on sharing knowledge and collaborate with other initiatives and partners to drive ambition.
- 4Ps: commit to progress in the process to the race: Pledge, Plan, Proceed and Publish.

There will be specific questions for each of these inclusion/exclusion criteria. IF THE INITIATIVE DOES NOT MEET OR AGREE THESE INCLUSION/EXCLUSION CRITERIA, IT CANNOT BE PART OF THE CAMPAIGN.

DECISION CRITERIA refer to criteria from which the ERG members have to make their assessment and decide to recommend or not an initiative to become a partner. The initiative has to be willing to commit to this matter and justify it.

The initiatives wishing to join the campaign must:

- Resilience: Be committed to increasing resilience.
- Theory of change: Deliver a step-change in global ambition for climate resilience.
- Inclusivity: Be committed to delivering inclusive and equitable actions to people from vulnerable and marginalised groups and communities to climate risks.
- Sustainability: Not take actions which harm nature and ecosystems.
- Impact (or have the potential to impact) at scale (over 100.000 people).
- Governance: Have the operational capacity and an active host that can collect and provide R2R with the data required for quantitative and/or qualitative metrics purposes.
- Pledge:
 - Commit to setting a target for resilience action for the partner initiative and its members (which impacts or systemic shifts does your initiative pledge to achieve?). The initiative has between 3 and 6 months after joining the campaign to refine its Pledge(s) and ask its members to agree on it/them. If the initiative does not have a numeric target, it has to be willing to present a numeric pledge and present a plan on how to create that pledge up to 3 months from the moment you are admitted in the campaign.
 - Initiatives also have to be willing to translate the pledges into numbers of people or hectares of land with increased resilience (using the Metrics Framework we will provide).
- Plan: Commit to presenting a clear and evidence-based plan to take action towards its committed pledge(s) in the next 3-6 months after presenting the pledge (how -through which actions- do you or your members plan to achieve it?).
- Process: Commit to taking effective and immediate action towards achieving its pledge(s).
- Publish: Commit to providing the results and outcomes (reporting) that your
 actions are achieving and the evidence to back them (which validated outcomes
 have these actions achieved so far?). To raise ambitions on targets and make
 new commitments and report on its targets at COP and beyond.



Eligibility criteria (continued)

Here are some definitions that may help your submission:

- Partner: is an initiative that is part of the R2R campaign.
- Members: refers to organizations or individuals that are part of the Partner Initiative. They became a member after a membership process.
- Host: refers to the organization or committee/board that is at the head of a partner initiative.
- Numeric pledge: a number in terms of individuals, companies, countries, regions OR natural systems.
- Translate into the number of people: how a numeric pledge that is not focused on individuals is translated into individuals.
